

EXPLORE Thallon

Queensland's first silo art calls Thallon home, welcoming you into town with the striking GrainCorp mural, "The Watering Hole". Spanning over four 30 metre silos, this work of art was created in 2017 by Brisbane artists Drapl and The Zookeeper from a single A4 sketch. Showcasing scenes significant to the region, it is best viewed from the designated platform.

A short walk to the old rail bridge leads to the "Rogues Gallery", a captivating collection of larger-than-life portraits of local identities. First created by Drapl and The Zookeeper in 2019, the gallery continues to grow, adding new faces over time.

As you explore, discover sculptures speckled throughout town, including William the Wombat in the town park, a two-metre piece celebrating the region's connection to the Northern Hairy Nosed Wombat.

For local tips and regional goods, visit the Thallon Information Station. Open seasonally, hours vary. Check Facebook for current times.

The Thallon Rail Centre, offers a glimpse into the town's rail history inside the restored 1913 Goods Shed, featuring vintage equipment and original markings. Pop into the café, pub or Information Station for access, \$5 per person.

The Thallon Campgrounds sit close to the silos and provide a peaceful place to stay, with powered sites and amenities available for a small fee, payable at the pub.

Before you leave, enjoy a coffee at the cafe or meal at the Francis Hotel, a welcoming hub known for its country hospitality and local knowledge.
